### CHARTER OAK CULTURAL CENTER

Charter Oak Cultural Center, a multi-cultural arts center housed in the first synagogue built in Connecticut, is committed to doing the work of social justice through the arts. ### **VOICES OF HOPE**

#### "When you listen to a witness, you become a witness." – Elie Wiesel

In 2020, the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany released the results of a comprehensive 50-state study of Holocaust knowledge and awareness among American millennials and Gen-Z. The shocking results revealed that 48% of U.S. millennials and Gen-Z are not able to name even a single concentration camp, 63% do not know the number of Jews who

were killed, 11% believe Jews caused the Holocaust and 49% have witnessed Holocaust denial or distortion online. Our collective vow to "Never Forget" is at risk of being broken. In order to prevent the hatred which gave rise to the Holocaust, we must be vigilant in our efforts to educate every generation about the danger of intolerance.

Voices of Hope was founded by children of Holocaust survivors who came together with the determination to honor their families' histories by creating a culture of courage to stand up against hatred through Holocaust and genocide education and remembrance. We have a collective responsibility to speak and act out against hatred to prevent future atrocities. We focus on the brave actions of those who resisted and the Righteous Among Nations to inspire us to be forces for good. We share the stories of survivors and their ability to rebuild their lives in the aftermath of destruction to provide an empowering message of resiliency. Horrifically, genocides continue to occur, and our education about these are a sober reminder that we cannot stop fighting evil.

Hearing firsthand testimony helps students understand the roots and ramifications of prejudice and the dangers of remaining silent in a unique way. The impact is best demonstrated by a student's own words after meeting with a survivor: "[a]nother thing that you said that affected me was encouraging us, the people of the future to speak up. When I witness injustices, I will admit I don't help out as

much as I can. But after realizing the extent hatred can reach, I want to take your advice [on how to] extinguish hatred when it first appears."

The time is approaching when there will no longer be the opportunity to hear firsthand testimony about the Holocaust. Yet, hatred continues to rise, and voices of the extremists are ever louder. We are working with survivors' descendants - children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren - to carry on their families' legacies by becoming the next generation of witnesses.

Our legacy donors are individuals like you who understand that Voices of Hope's work is as relevant and urgent as it has ever been before. Please join with us to ensure our critical work continues long into the future.
