Philanthropic Opportunities Abound

"Tough times never last. But tough people do." — Robert Schuller

In a time when Zoom replaced in-person interaction, kitchen tables substituted for office desks, and the only certainty was uncertainty, the Foundation's donors, Trustees, lay leaders and staff banded together to provide good measures of hope and long-term stability to our community's institutions and people.

The Jewish Hartford Rapid Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF), a joint initiative of the Jewish Federation and Foundation, distributed \$591,000 to 28 Jewish organizations to help stabilize operations and ensure continuity for their invaluable work. Our community partners and front-line workers have demonstrated remarkable grit, innovation and dedication to serving the greater good; we are proud to be their partners (see page 21).

The Foundation distributed \$4.4 million in total grants, with over \$3 million going to our local Jewish organizations. These include Board-directed grants from our unrestricted Community Action Funds, such as \$150,000 to the Mandell JCC and \$25,000 to Chabad's Friendship Circle to help alleviate financial distress caused by COVID-19 (see page 21).

As important, we continued building for the future by launching Greater Hartford's LIFE & LEGACY

program, a joint initiative with the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, which aims to endow our Jewish community organizations through after-lifetime gifts. Fourteen partner organizations receive training, materials, consultation and coordination from the Foundation and Grinspoon professionals (see page 4).

The Foundation and the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving are also partnering to provide administrative support for Endow Hartford 21, an initiative of the Zachs Family Foundation with 51 participating Jewish and secular local organizations (see page 12).

We invite you to read more about these efforts, the impact they're having on people's lives and on the vitality of our institutions. You'll see compelling stories about our donors and discover how and why they are investing in our community's long-term vibrancy. You'll learn how a robust stock market and expert management from our Investment Committee yielded a 34.5 percent return on our investment pool, growing it close to \$169 million by June 30, 2021 (see pages 44-47).

We have much for which to be grateful. We believe our community will emerge stronger — and more confident — for weathering the challenges of the pandemic. We look forward to celebrating the Foundation's 50th anniversary with you in 2022 and thanking you for your enduring generosity of time, spirit and resources — toward ensuring our vibrant Jewish future.

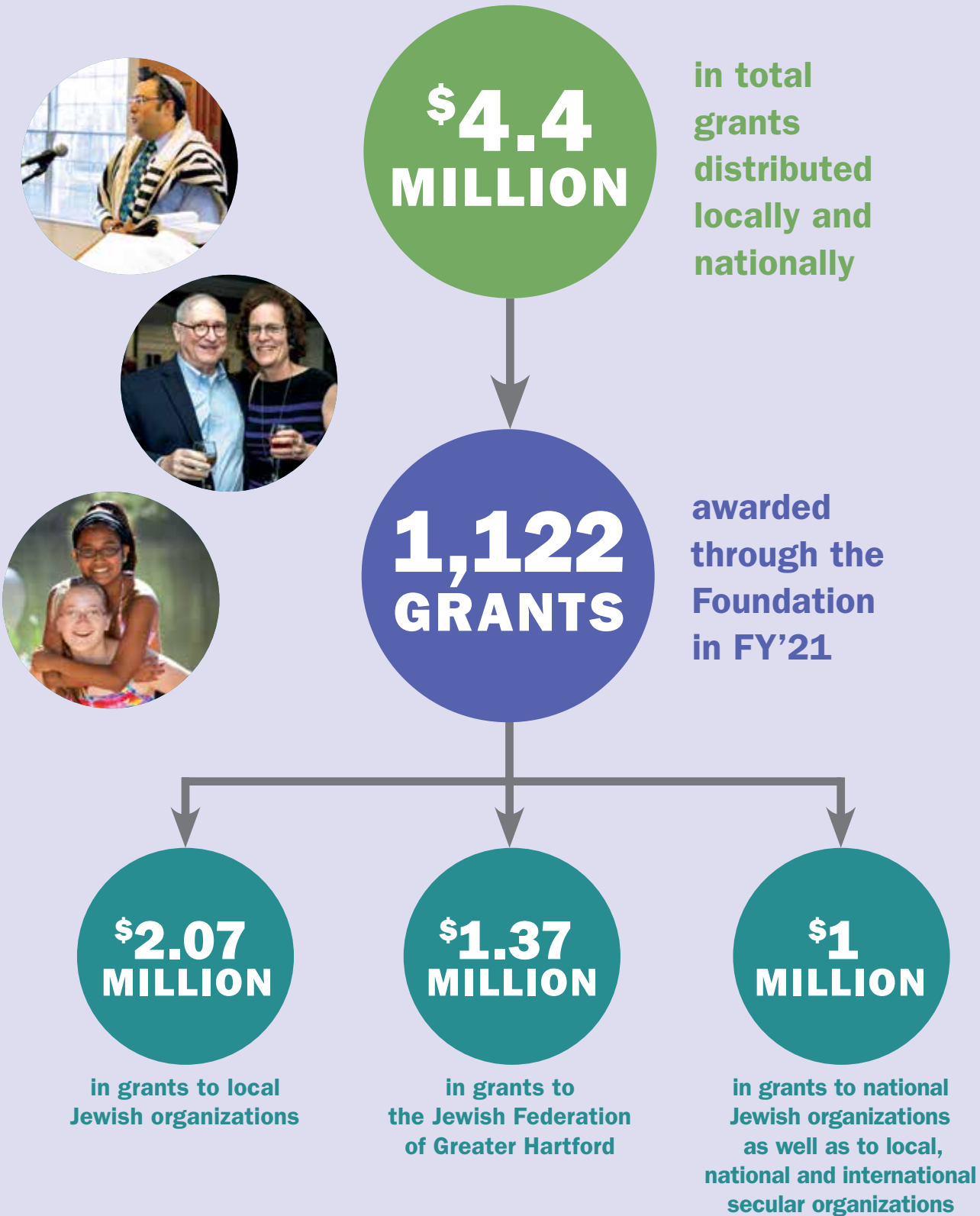

FY'2021: Philanthropy Makes an Impact



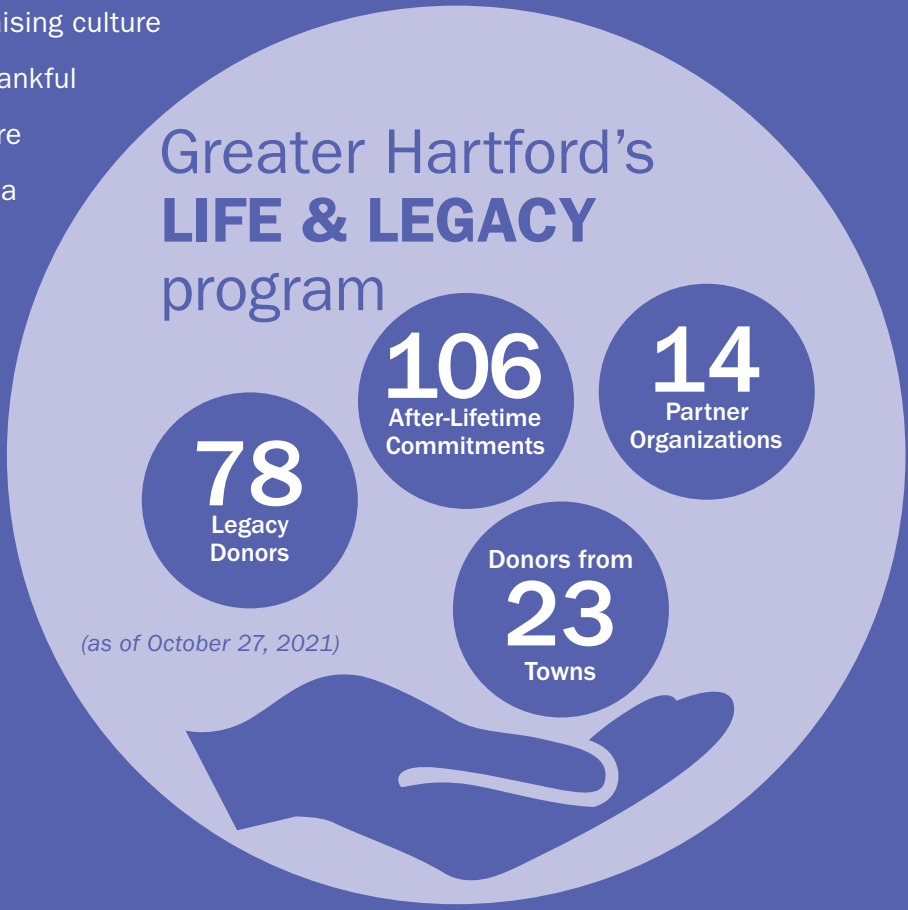
Through the Rapid Relief and Recovery Fund for COVID-19, the Foundation and Federation granted \$591,000 in FY'21 to 28 agencies.

LIFE & LEGACY

In 2020, the Foundation kicked off Greater Hartford's four-year legacy giving initiative with 14 Jewish organizations as part of Harold Grinspoon Foundation's LIFE & LEGACY program.

JCF is one of 72 communities nationwide taking part in LIFE & LEGACY, which promotes after-lifetime giving to build endowments that will provide financial stability for Jewish organizations.

In partnership with the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, JCF provides training, consulting, coaching, and marketing along with incentive grants to partner organizations. The grants encourage organizations to prioritize legacy giving and evolve from a fundraising culture to a culture of philanthropy. We are thankful to all of our community leaders who are helping us achieve our shared goal of a vibrant, joyous Jewish community for generations to come.

We were the only family on our street not to have a Christmas tree at our house, but it was nice to have our neighbors over and introduce them to our traditions (latkes, as always, were a huge hit!).

Growing up was Sunday/Hebrew school, bat mitzvah classes, regular trips to shul, USY and a non-Jewish summer camp (Camp Jewell). I didn’t really find my feet as an independent, practicing Jew

until my mid-forties, during a time of tremendous personal losses. My first-ever trip to Israel came as an adult about six years ago. Truly transformational.

With all of the upheaval in the world right now, I feel immensely blessed to live where I can worship freely and in safety. I am so fortunate to be a member of this community, and I cherish the legacy built by the generations before me. I want to ensure that those who come after me can know the same sense of safety, welcome and community that was here before me. That is why I am leaving a legacy. I hope my legacy gift will offer the same never-to-be-taken-for-granted blessings for the generations who come after me.

Paying It Forward for Generations

Temkin Family Promises First Commitment to LIFE & LEGACY Program

Gayle and Steve Temkin don’t remember a time when Jewish community wasn’t central to their lives. Judaism wasn’t just about religion and values; they felt part of a global Jewish community, which came with a deep sense of responsibility to be active participants in all aspects of that community.

Today, one might see their teenagers, Alyssa and Lily, actively participating in Jewish life at the Mandell JCC, Solomon Schechter Day School, Beth El Temple, JTConnect, Friendship Circle, and more. The Temkins’ commitment to Jewish life, however, extends far beyond today. Jewish community runs through generations — dating back to Gayle’s participation in United Synagogue Youth as a girl, and her professional career with State of Israel Bonds in Rockland County, and later the UJA Federation of New York in Westchester.

A quote from Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, z”l, demonstrates their philosophy: “To be a leader, you do not need a crown or robes of office. All you need to do is to write your chapter in the story, do deeds that heal some of the pain of this world, and act so that others become a little better for having known you.”

“We try to live by these words, not just for today but for our future,” says Gayle. “We’ve chosen this community to plant our family’s roots — so that our children, and our children’s children, and everyone who comes after will have not only a strong community, but one that will always remember those who came before them.”

That’s why they have promised an after-lifetime gift of \$1 million to Greater Hartford’s Jewish

community. Their generous act officially launched LIFE & LEGACY for Greater Hartford, a four-year partnership with the Jewish Community Foundation and the Harold Grinspoon Foundation that promotes after-lifetime giving to build endowments that will help provide financial stability to 14 local Jewish organizations.

“We want Alyssa and Lily to understand the importance of paying it forward, and want to help our community organizations remain vital and vibrant,” adds Steve. “A legacy gift will let us make a difference — far beyond the measure of one lifetime — and offer a joyous Jewish life for all.” In addition to the Temkins’ commitment, **106 after-lifetime commitments from 78 legacy donors** have been made to Greater Hartford’s LIFE & LEGACY program, to ensure the future of our community forever.

Acting on Jewish Values

Michael and Naomi Cohen Support the Community Through Service and Planful Giving

When reflecting on living Jewishly, Michael and Naomi Cohen share a commitment to fulfilling the Jewish teaching of *tikkun olam*. For them, volunteering and philanthropy have been an obvious way of life, built on the model of acting on one’s values that they learned from their parents — who they describe as “great teachers.”

The Cohens were both born in Hartford, and together they have lived, worked and raised their three sons in Greater Hartford. “Everything that has brought us joy and good fortune has come to us from within this community,” Michael says, “and we feel it’s not only a responsibility but also a privilege to give back to the community that has given our family so much.”

Jewish Coalition for Literacy (now Children’s Reading Partners), and each has served as a President of Beth El Temple. The next logical step for them, Naomi says, “was to plan giving beyond our lifetime to honor our heritage and to sustain the vibrant and vital Jewish community organizations upon which so many rely so often.”

Through their estate planning, endowment funds at the Foundation will benefit Children’s Reading Partners, Beth El Temple and Jewish Family Services. The Foundation is the custodian of those and many other endowments, both designated for specific organizations and also as unrestricted dollars. “It’s important for us to leave endowments because the Foundation is going to be here long after our lifetimes,” Michael explains.

“Just like our parents could have never imagined what the needs of today would be, Michael and I cannot imagine what unmet needs there will be years from now,” Naomi concludes.

Zachs Family Foundation Launches Endowment Initiative with \$1 Million Matching Grant

Endow Hartford 21, launched in June 2021 by the Zachs Family Foundation, is a bold effort to encourage endowment giving to help secure the future of 51 Hartford institutions. The program was initiated by Henry M. Zachs, who saw the “need for endowments becoming more urgent than ever,” as local organizations navigate uncertain times and rely mostly on the “unpredictability of annual giving” to maintain their operations.

Lead donors have already contributed \$1.7 million to the program that will provide a 1:2 match for each organization; the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving and JCF serve as administering organizations.

“The 1:2 match inspires donors large and small to give generously to support the long-term future of the organizations they love, which forms the bedrock of our community,” says Henry M. Zachs. “Special thanks to the Advisory Board — JoAnn Price, Marilda Gándara, David Miller and Eric Zachs, who have generously given their time to support this effort — as well as Bonnie Malley, Deborah Rothstein, Kathryn Gonnerman, Ruth Sovronsky, and Sara Gelpke, who put this project together.”

Foundation Launches Virtual Donor Education Program

Giving Circles Support Local Youth

Our giving circles awarded their annual grants to two local nonprofit organizations that provide essential services to abused and at-risk children and youth.

JewGood Hartford for young professionals gave a \$10,000 grant to COMPASS Youth Collaborative’s Junior Peacebuilders program, which serves youth who are at high risk of perpetrating or becoming victims of violence. The Hartford-based program teaches life skills and builds a positive, neighborhood-based youth coalition.

The Lillian Fund for women awarded a \$10,000 grant to Klingberg Family Centers of New Britain, to support the Children’s Advocacy Center, a multidisciplinary partnership that investigates allegations of child abuse and exploitation in a child-friendly, developmentally and clinically appropriate, and culturally sensitive manner.

- deepen their knowledge of endowment
- explore social issues through visits to local nonprofits
- create new connections with people who practice *tikkun olam*.

Community Grants Program

Board-directed Community Action grants from the Foundation's Unrestricted Funds support the long-term strength and vitality of the Greater Hartford Jewish community. The Foundation seeks unique opportunities to strategically invest in programs and services that might not be possible without the Foundation's support. Here are a few highlights from FY'21.

Safeguarding our Community Against Anti-Semitism

The Foundation awarded a \$50,000 grant to help launch the Jewish Hartford Secure Community Initiative to help combat the growing danger of violent anti-Semitism.

The new program is led by the Jewish Federation in partnership with the Secure Community Network, a national nonprofit devoted to protecting the Jewish community.

The grant supported hiring a security director to work with a security committee to oversee the initiative, and the convening of a security council comprising representatives from agencies and synagogues across the Greater Hartford region to provide ongoing guidance.

The new security director, John Colangelo, is playing a key role in bolstering site security, delivering community training, strengthening relationships and intelligence sharing with law enforcement, facilitating emergency communications and response, and accessing government funds for security enhancements.

Strengthening the Community During COVID

COVID-19 created intense challenges for the people, agencies and synagogues in Greater Hartford, but our community persevered thanks in part to generous donors who gave to the Jewish Hartford Rapid Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF).

Launched in 2020 as a partnership between the Foundation and Federation, the RRRF provided emergency financial assistance to individuals and grants to 28 Jewish institutions to minimize interruption to the vital programs and services they provide. Organizational leaders found ways to get creative, exploring the ins and outs of the Passover seder on Zoom, offering virtual exercise classes, and teaching children in socially-distanced outdoor classrooms.

Through the support of over 500 generous donors, the RRRF granted a total of \$675,000 in the past two years and earmarked \$125,000 for future

humanitarian assistance and financial aid to agencies and synagogues during the pandemic.

Sustaining Operations for Vital Organizations

The Foundation awarded grants to the Mandell Jewish Community Center (\$150,000) and Chabad Friendship Circle (\$25,000) to help stabilize and sustain their operations as they grapple with the pandemic's financial impact. "These funds enabled us to continue supporting our community by allowing us to maintain our staffing levels. This made a meaningful difference for community members and our employees," says David Jacobs, Executive Director, Mandell JCC.

The Mosses’ New Fund Meets their Giving Goals

When Isaac ‘Yitz’ and Juanita Moss contemplated a move from Chicago to Greater Hartford, discovering a small town with a robust Jewish community sealed the deal — and they haven’t looked back since. “There’s a ton of Jewish community here — a Kosher food store, Jewish schools, synagogues,” says Yitz. “All of a sudden, we had an automatic social network.” Adds Juanita, “We received a beautiful, warm welcome.”

In the ten years they’ve lived in West Hartford, Juanita and Yitz have become strong advocates and community leaders, in the spirit of welcoming others the way they were welcomed. In addition to volunteering at their synagogue, Young Israel of West Hartford, they are Co-Presidents of the Board of Directors for New England Jewish Academy (NEJA) and were instrumental in the merger that created NEJA.

The Mosses have also invested time in leadership training, which Yitz calls a game changer. “The Wexner Training Program expanded my horizons and gave us new connections,” explains Yitz. “We learned how various organizations need to work together for transformative change in the community.” Juanita expanded her network and appreciation for the community while participating in the Jewish Leadership Academy’s (JLA) Community Leadership Initiative.

The Mosses believe that great community leadership embraces the success of the whole community, not just one organization. That’s one major reason the couple established a Donor Advised Fund at the Foundation, which allows them to recommend grants to different causes and adapt their giving over time, while also including their children in the process as they grow older. “We want to set an example for others to support institutions and the broader community by partnering with the Jewish Community Foundation,” say Juanita and Yitz.

Legacy Continues for CBI Sisterhood

In the 1950s, the Sisterhood of Congregation Beth Israel (CBI) Judaica Shop was an active enterprise in the corner of the Temple lobby selling items to raise funds for the religious education for children. Filled with Kiddush Cups, Menorahs, Seder Plates, prayer books — and more — the Shop quickly became a hub for families to mingle, celebrate their Jewish heritage, and purchase Judaica, and remained so for almost 70 years.

Sisterhood members lovingly volunteered for “Shop Duty” Sunday mornings (and Fridays before services in the early years). For a long while, Bev and Lionel Jackowitz ran the Shop.

“Bev was the quiet, astute doer, always warm and welcoming — often times with a silly joke to cheer any Shop visitor,” reminisces CBI Sisterhood member, Paula Schenck. “Lionel was our honorary Sisterhood member who, with Devida Botwick and Fayette Gordon, kept the Shop going through the 1990s and early 2000s.”

Affectionately known as the Shop Girls, Sandra Berinstein, Barbara Honor, Gail Mangs, Paula Schenck, and Ruth VanWinkle maintained the Sunday morning social corner, conducted fundraisers, and bought and sold Judaica . . . all in support of youth education at CBI. Working with Sisterhood President Gayle Wintjen, the Shop Girls recommended a change!

FY'21 Financials

The Jewish Community Foundation of Greater Hartford has a mandate to fulfill its role in Greater Hartford by maximizing dollars available for making grants today and ensuring that charitable dollars entrusted to it are available in perpetuity.

A well-diversified investment strategy and the generosity of our donors enable JCF to meet these objectives.

Investment Portfolio

JCF's assets are managed in a commingled investment pool. JCF has a long-term investment horizon with relatively low liquidity needs. For these reasons, the portfolio can tolerate short- and intermediate-term volatility in the interest of generating higher returns over the long-term.

Financial Oversight

JCF's Investment Committee crafts and implements investment policy and monitors the individual investment managers and their performance. The Investment Committee is assisted by an independent consulting firm, Crewcial Partners, LLC of New York, NY.

The managed investment portfolio includes traditional equity and fixed income investments and alternatives, including private equity, emerging markets and real assets/ commodities. Diversification among multiple asset classes helps to reduce the volatility of JCF's portfolio and moderates market risk.

Spending Policy

By using a spending policy, JCF helps ensure that charitable funds will be protected for the future while continuing to have impact today. The policy determines the amount that will be available for grant-making and to support JCF's operating budget. The 2021 spending rate was 5% of the previous 20-quarters' average ending value of each fund, subject to a 4% floor and 5.5% ceiling of current fair market value.

Expenses

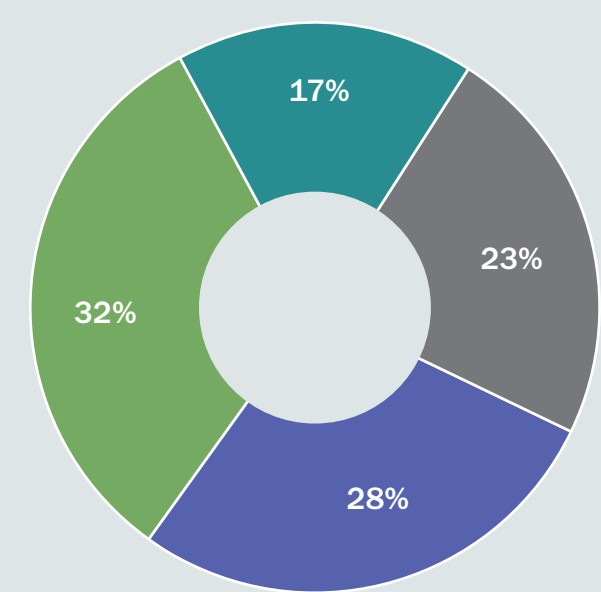
JCF's management and Board of Trustees take careful steps to ensure that the operating expenses are kept as low as possible. JCF's expense to asset ratio for the year was 0.97%.

As of June 30, 2021

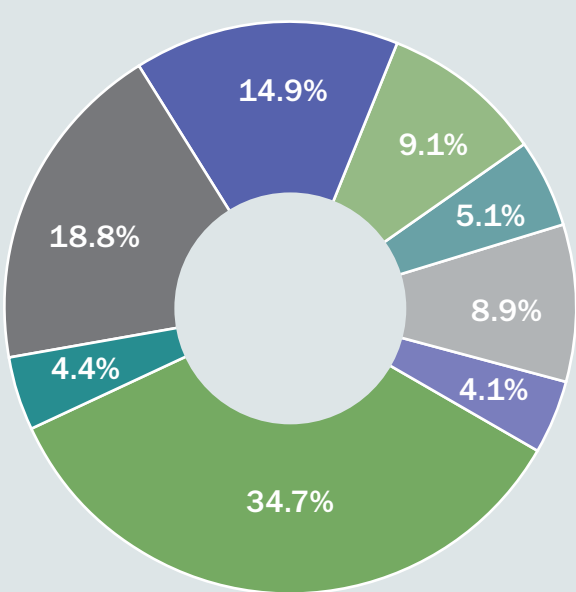

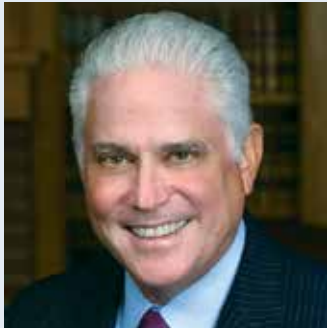
