Shabbat Your Way

UConn Hillel

Jewish Family Services of Greater Hartford (JFS)

With limited office space and an increased demand for mental health services, JFS must move some administrative staff to make room for new clinicians to have private offices. Your grant will help JFS install specialized sound dampening cubicles that allow for shared space among staff.

JFS

Although JFS has made great strides toward meeting the needs of Holocaust survivors, there is still a dire need to provide for their homecare. German government reparations do not cover the full cost of homecare, and limiting this essential need could mean the risk of falls and other dangerous living conditions. Educational Arts Theater Experience

Post War and Trama Support for Teenage Ukranian Refugees

Schoke Jewish Family Services of Fairfield County (Schoke JFS)

Schoke JFS will introduce trauma-informed, psychosocial support for Ukrainian refugee teenagers fleeing war and grappling with all they saw, lost, and long for far from home. Your grant will help fund mental health support groups and one-on-one counseling to eight individuals initially, as Schoke JFS helps these teenagers adapt to and build their new lives.

Holocaust Survivor Services Isolation Reduction Programs

To connect and support Holocaust Survivors throughout CT and across the country, Schoke JFS will introduce wellness programs online and in-person including yoga, brain fitness, socialization, and special interest programming. Your grant will support these initiatives and reduce isolation for more than 100 survivors. \$2,500

Therapeutic Horseback Riding

Jewish Association for Community Living (JCL)

Therapeutic horseback riding is proven to be a great therapy modality for people with disabilities; benefits include an increase in balance, sensory input, increased responsibility, and improved motor skills. Please consider recommending a grant to JCL for residents to enjoy the many benefits of horseback riding.

Community Garden

A grant to support a garden plot at one of JCL's local community gardens will give residents a chance to learn how to grow their own produce. Piano Keyboards for Kids Solomon Schechter Day School

In fun, hands-on music classes, Schechter students learn the basics of pitch, rhythm and tempo, and are exposed to recorders and percussion instruments.
