How much does it cost to open a Celebration Fund?

Your Celebration Fund can be created easily with a gift of \$5,000 or \$10,000, depending on the type of fund you choose.

Who can donate to my fund?

Anyone can donate. An individual, family, guests at your celebration, or through crowd-funding — all of these are great ways to engage others in your giving.

How can someone contribute to my fund?

We accept gifts in many forms — including check, credit card, stocks, real estate, or other assets.

You may qualify for tax advantages^{*} in the year you open your fund.

How do I start the process of opening a Celebration Fund?

We make it easy! All it takes to formalize your fund is a gift and a short agreement that we draft for you.
