HUMAN SERVICES

Support Victims of the LA Wildfires

Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford

Training to Effectively Work with Children with Special Needs Mandell Jewish Community Center (JCC)

Since the pandemic, the JCC has observed a larger and growing number of children with special needs, including psycho-social concerns. Your grant will fund trainings for preschool teachers, camp counselors and other staff, so they have the tools and skills they need to holistically address the needs of children.

Rock Steady Boxing for Parkinson's Disease

The JCC wants to offer Rock Steady Boxing, an evidence-based program designed to impact the systems and slow progression of Parkinson's disease. This well-known program is offered nationwide, but not in our area. Your grant will cover licensing fees and instructor training.

Community Food Insecurity Data

Many of our neighbors are experiencing food insecurity. However, there has not been a thorough study to find the extent of food insecurity issues in kosher households in CT or even how many households keep kosher or would prefer to keep kosher. Your grant will fund the costs of JFS working with researchers to learn about these needs and how JFS staff can address them.

Replace Broken Computers and Replace Technology

JFS has a staff of behavioral health clinicians and case managers, many of whom are using old computers in need of replacement, but JFS has run out of technology funds. Your grant will allow JFS to cover the cost of devices and software that will improve its ability to support the community.

This spring Shabbaton is for 30-50 students, who are eager to make Jewish connections outside of UConn. The event will be done in partnership with the Hillels at University of Hartford, Trinity College, Connecticut College and Yale University.

Imagination Playground is child-directed and open-ended, encouraging self-expression through deep, joyful play.
