This system is used to communicate accurate information to meet hosts and governing bodies.


## OUTREACH

### HERO Summer Institute for Educators

Voices of Hope

Voices of Hope's Holocaust Education Resource and Outreach Center (HERO), a joint initiative between the Maurice Greenberg Center for Judaic Studies and Voices of Hope, will host a three-day Summer Institute for Connecticut educators. Your grant will cover the costs of keynote speakers' honoraria, teaching resources and materials, food, lodging, and stipends to ensure broad educator participation and learning.

### Beatrice Fox Auerbach Early Childhood Center (ECC)

Each kit will include tools, visuals, and language educators can use when children feel overwhelmed, stored in accessible pouches for quick classroom use.

### Rekindle

The program strengthens social cohesion by equipping participants with the relationships and tools needed to collaborate across differences.

## SPECIAL POPULATIONS

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### **Purim in the Wild West**

Chabad Friendship Circle

You can support an inclusive holiday celebration for families with children with special needs, featuring circus activities and entertainment. Your grant will help connect children with disabilities and teenage volunteers in a supportive environment, and feel the JOY of Judaism!

### **Children's Mental Health Needs**

Jewish Family Services (JFS)

JFS is a nationally-accredited, licensed outpatient clinic, serving more than 150 children. The nonprofit provides psychiatric care, allowing children who need extra support to receive prescribed medications. Insurance coverage and copays do not fully cover the cost of this essential service, but your support will help make sure it is available.

### **Plant Therapy**

Jewish Association for Community Living (JCL)

Your grant will deliver the healing benefits of plant therapy to individuals being served by JCL. Through monthly sessions, about 10 participants engage in hands-on gardening that reduces stress, builds motor skills, and fosters a sense of purpose and connection.

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### **Getting History into the World**

Jewish Historical Society (JHS)

The JHS collection catalog is a vital database of the organization's holdings. Limited staff capacity makes it difficult to respond to all information requests, but putting the catalog on the nonprofit's website makes it more visible and available. Your grant will fund professional installation of software to keep this resource automatically updated and accessible to all online.

### **Set the Scene for History**

Jewish Historical Society

Imagine a quiet, comfortable space for filming the community's next generation oral history interviews and video creations. JHS needs funding for a backdrop, comfortable armchairs and other necessities to create a set for its long- and short-form digital filming initiatives that will make history come alive.
