50th Anniversary Mosaic Project Engages More Than 950 Community Members

This Mosaic is a gift to the community from the Jewish Community Foundation of Greater Hartford in honor of its 50th anniversary. More than 950 community members, ages 2 to 99, participated in laying its 40,000 tiles in April 2022 at the Mandell Jewish Community Center. The Mosaic exemplifies our conviction that each person can make a difference, and together we can build a better world.

This work of art exhibits the dynamism and diversity of the Greater Hartford Jewish community. Represented are the Mandell JCC, a synagogue, Jonathan's Dream Playground, helping hands and colorful foliage. These reflect our community's brilliant features of spiritual power, vibrant culture, inclusion, loving kindness and stunning landscapes.

We Believe in Our Community

In 1972, Melvin Title and I. Martin Fierberg encouraged Federation leaders to allocate \$50,000 to start a Community Endowment Fund. They *believed* that our small and mighty community had the vision and the confidence to build a reliable pool of endowment funds that would one day help ensure our community's financial strength — and vibrancy — for generations to come.

Often in Jewish communal life, it seems hard to justify funding the *next* generations of Jews, while the pressing needs of our community require so much attention. But through good and challenging times, the Foundation's donors, Trustees, stakeholders and staff rose to the challenges of the past 50 years — and kept building our Jewish future. They believed in the joy, responsibility and value of living a full Jewish life — and wanted their great-grandchildren to have the same Jewish opportunities they enjoyed so much. They imagined a world that did not yet exist and were bold enough to set aside the funding and erect the structures to make the unknown happen.

The Foundation has had the privilege of working with such extraordinary individuals who not only imagined what the Foundation and Jewish community could be but also invested the time, work, wisdom and resources to make the magic of philanthropy happen.

The numbers on the opposite page tell part of the story: In 50 years, the Foundation, through the generosity of its donors, has granted **\$81 million**

and currently manages 1,400 funds and \$155 million in assets.

We can confidently say that the vision of our Founders is being realized. In FY2022, the Foundation through its donors:

- Achieved a **record \$15 million** in fund development
- Expanded its Community Action Grants Program to allow synagogues to apply for capacity building grants of up to \$10,000, which is rare in the Jewish Federation/Foundation worlds.
- Brought the LIFE & LEGACY initiative to help our community partners garner commitments for after-lifetime gifts. In Year One of this four-year effort, funded in partnership with the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, *14 local Jewish agencies and synagogues secured 267 after-lifetime commitments from 180 donors worth an estimated future value of \$7.5 million.*

Imagine what we can accomplish together over the next 50 years!

As Theodore Herzl famously said, “if you will it, it is no dream.” We are eternally grateful to all our donors, Board Chairs, Trustees and staff for having the imagination and determination to do what few believed could be achieved in such a short time.

We know you'll enjoy reading this tribute to our leaders, donors and front-line community partners, whose sacred work keeps Judaism relevant, kind, inspiring, active and vibrant.

Jewish Community Foundation Flourishes Through the Decades

1970s



1972 — Federation allocates \$50,000 to establish the Endowment Fund of the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford, now the Jewish Community Foundation of Greater Hartford.

1975 — A JCF Community Action Grant launches a public hotline providing 1,000 people in Greater Hartford carrying Tay-Sachs disease with much-needed information, screenings and genetic counseling.

1980s



1982 — The Jewish Association for Community Living (JCL) receives a JCF Community Action Grant to help establish the first of four Jewish group homes for persons with intellectual and developmental challenges.

Today, JCL operates four local group homes and additional living facilities for 37 people.

1987 — In an emergency response, the Trustees issue a \$75,000 JCF Community Action Grant to help settle over 1,000 Ethiopian Jews in Afula, Israel.

1990s



1990 — Through a \$53,000 JCF Community Action Grant, Jewish Family Services resettles over 200 Russian Jews in Hartford, providing them with housing, food, clothing and employment counseling.

1999 — A group of passionate women launch the Lillian Fund giving circle for women — the Foundation's first-ever Endowment Fund dedicated to supporting women and children's issues. *In total, the Lillian Fund has received 1,952 gifts and has awarded \$147,053 in grants.*

Our founders believe in Jewish continuity and the power of our community.

It began with a vision conceived by a group of passionate leaders: a vibrant Jewish community in Greater Hartford supported by endowments, to ensure that we thrive for generations. Guided by their Jewish values and foresight, our founders believe in Jewish continuity and the power of our community. We are grateful for their continuing inspiration and commitment. Here are a few highlights of the growth of our community.

2000s



2000 — A bequest from Holocaust survivors Dr. Leizer and Barbara Kessel launches a scholarship fund, *providing more than \$642,000 in scholarships to students from 2000-2022.*

2006 — A JCF Community Action Grant invests in a new Family Room Parenting Center at the Mandell Jewish Community Center to inspire learning experiences among parents of children ages five and under. *To date, hundreds of families enjoy this shared community space.*

2010s



2012 — A first-of-its-kind initiative, Big Tent Judaism launches through a \$96,000 JCF Community Action Grant. The program assists synagogues and agencies to become more welcoming for Jews of all backgrounds. Organizations provide meaningful connections among thousands of people, *using many new approaches that are still engaging community members today.*

2017 — The Scholarship Committee launches the Israel Experience Scholarship, providing funding for immersive programs in Israel to help teens explore their Jewish identity. *As of June 2022, the program has funded more than 150 students, granting a total of \$405,000 for Israel Scholarships.*

2020s



2020 — Federation and the Foundation launch the Rapid Relief and Recovery Fund, raising and granting *nearly \$1 million in emergency relief for individuals and organizations impacted by COVID-19.*

2021 — Mikveh Bess Israel receives a 3-year \$75,000 JCF Capacity Building Grant to hire its first Executive Director to professionalize its service delivery and fundraising, and advance the agency's goals.

2022 — Russia's invasion of Ukraine prompts an outpouring of generosity for refugees from our Trustees and Donor Advised Fund holders. For more details, please see the full story on page 19.

Endowment Giving Strengthens Our Community

From its beginning, the Foundation has been cultivating a culture of endowment giving that provides permanent financial resources for Greater Hartford's Jewish organizations.

Over the years, the Foundation has led a successful series of endowment initiatives to benefit our community organizations, from the Endowment Challenge of the mid-2000s to the Aim Chai Community Endowment Campaign of the 2010s, to our current LIFE & LEGACY program.

Using innovation, collaboration and community-wide education, each program deepens the community's ability to thrive today and for generations to come.

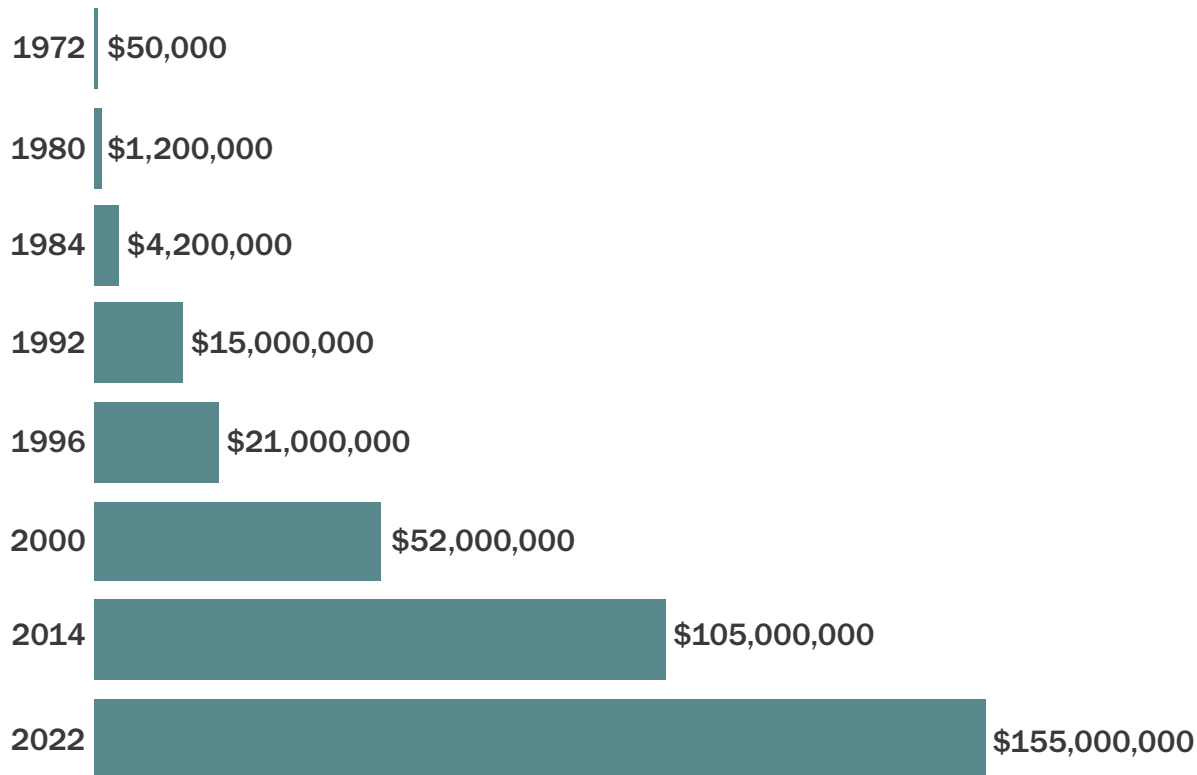

Celebrating LIFE & LEGACY: Investing in Future Decades



We celebrated the success of year one of the LIFE & LEGACY program during a community celebration on June 12. Greater Hartford's LIFE & LEGACY is a partnership between the Foundation and the Harold Grinspoon Foundation to promote after lifetime giving to build endowments that will help provide financial stability to local Jewish organizations.

The Foundation awarded \$72,500 in cash incentive grants to community partners that completed the first year and reached their goals (see p. 12). In addition, the Foundation received a 1:2 matching grant of \$100,000 from the Grinspoon Foundation to help fund this effort.

Endow Hartford Inspires a Culture of Endowment

When Henry Zachs thinks about endowing the future of Hartford, he doesn't just think about the next generation — as a great-grandfather, he focuses at least three generations into the future.

“Endow Hartford 21 is laying the groundwork for success — forever — for the entire Greater Hartford community,” says Henry. “That’s why we have over 50 organizations involved, and why I am so passionate about it.”

Great-grandmother Judy Zachs shares this mindset. “It has always been a priority for Henry and me to demonstrate to our children and grandchildren the importance of building community through leadership, board service, and financial support,” says Judy. “We have impressed this value upon our children and grandchildren who now continue this tradition of giving back and are passing it down to our great-grandchildren.”

A first-of-its-kind endowment matching program for Greater Hartford, Endow Hartford 21 was initiated by the Zachs Family Foundation. It is supported by many community-minded lead donors because they, like Henry, believe endowment can secure the future of Greater Hartford.

JCF is honored to partner with the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving to administer the endowments for participating organizations.

The match opportunity was first available to 51 local organizations between June 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. The 1:2 match seeks to inspire donors to give generously to support the long-term future of the organizations they love. Cumulatively,

those organizations raised more than \$1.3 million for their endowments, and in turn received a total of \$567,400 in matching funds!

Thirteen generous donors contributed \$1.62 million in matching funds. This match opportunity has motivated more than 600 community donors to support the endowments of these organizations.

With matching funds left over and a goal to raise more, Endow Hartford 21 has begun a second phase, with 11 new local organizations and 42 returning from the first round. Phase two runs from September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023.

“I have been lucky enough to thrive in Hartford, and the best part about making money here is that I can give more of it to the community,” says Henry. “We want to max out the match for every organization, and hope this leads to steady endowment growth for them.”

Foundation Grants Provide Relief for Ukrainian Refugees

Russia's invasion of Ukraine prompted an outpouring of generosity from our Trustees and Donor Advised Fund holders. Trustees granted \$50,000 and earmarked \$25,000 from Board-directed Funds to provide food, medication, temporary housing and other humanitarian needs to people caught and escaping violence in war-torn Ukraine. The grant was part of the Hartford Jewish community's fundraising efforts, led by the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford, for The Jewish Federations of North America's (JFNA) emergency campaign.

Donor Advised Fund holders recommended grants totaling \$216,000 to support JFNA's campaign and other nonprofit relief efforts including World Central Kitchen (WCK), which served over 100 million chef-prepared meals to Ukrainian refugees in more than 230 cities and towns. "Every time we deliver a plate of food...we are helping people suffering from this crazy invasion," says Chef Jose Andres, founder of WCK.

Giving Circles Grant \$20,000 to Local Nonprofits

The Foundation's giving circles, JewGood Hartford for young professionals, and the Lillian Fund for women, awarded their annual grants to three local nonprofits that make an impact in the lives of women and children in our community.

The Lillian Fund awarded \$10,000 to Girls for Technology to support its Building For Equity Accelerator & Pitch, a six-week program that helps Hartford Black and Brown female entrepreneurs overcome obstacles by providing access to education, resources and funding.

JewGood Hartford awarded two grants of \$5,000 each to Hartford Performs and Prudence Crandall Center. Hartford Performs, which brings teaching artists into Hartford Public Schools to provide arts-based programming in Pre-K to 8th-grade classrooms, is using its grant to fund Arts Integration at Dwight-Bellizzi Dual Language Academy.

The grant to Prudence Crandall Center (PCC) is funding the expansion of PCC's Supportive Housing Program. The initiative helps victims and families experiencing domestic violence move into newly available safe, stable, and affordable long-term housing — where they can continue to receive PCC's vital services — empowering them to break cycles of homelessness and abuse.

Grants Make a Difference

Technology Grant Helps Holocaust Survivors

A \$50,000 grant from The Genevieve and Joseph Weinstein Fund for Senior Adults at the Foundation supports a new technology pilot program for Jewish Family Services clients, with the goal of reducing social isolation.

Developed in Israel, the Uniper program helps Holocaust survivors and older adults who have experienced trauma to connect with their families on-screen and access quality programs anywhere in the world, anytime they want. Uniper's hardware

and software are easy to use and designed for older adults. The platform works on a TV, computer, tablet or mobile device, allowing users to navigate seamlessly through a broad variety of live and pre-recorded offerings. Older adults can pursue their passions, make new friends through group discussions, receive telehealth services and enjoy Shabbat services. So far, the program has been installed in 43 households. The grant is supporting the initial start-up year to launch the service in Greater Hartford.

Grants Provide Child Advocacy Training for Jewish Family Services

Grants to Jewish Family Services (JFS) were used to train its clinicians and staff, and service providers on the numerous laws and benefits that support children in crisis. JFS staff learned about the legal rights of low-income children and how providers can advocate for their clients to help obtain the resources they need to lead healthy, safe lives.

The training was led by the Center for Children's Advocacy (CCA), which connects families with a wide variety of government and local benefits. In addition to training, support through JCF Donor Advised Fund grants allowed JFS to work directly with CCA's benefits attorney to support clients facing challenges.

"We are so grateful for this incredible support that allowed us to work with the CCA," says Katie Hanley, CEO of JFS. "Our clinicians and other staff learned specific ways to support their clients, and we provided CCA with one-on-one support to help with difficult cases. Our relationship with CCA has blossomed, and we are working with their benefits attorney to develop a new program that will help clients become more financially stable."

Fund Holders Invest in New Science Curriculum at Solomon Schechter

Donor Advised Fund grants bolstered Solomon Schechter Day School's (SSDS) academic offerings by funding a new curriculum designed for Next Generation Science Standards. This national academic framework teaches students how to investigate and solve problems through interactive, hands-on lessons in science and engineering, and sparks their interest in these career fields.

"Schechter values the importance of a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) based curriculum to prepare our students for an ever changing career landscape," says Sherri Pliskin, Director of Development at SSDS. "Our school can offer innovative and challenging curricula thanks to the generous support of Foundation donors."

Holocaust Survivors and Families Receive Support

Donor Advised Fund holders supported a series of gatherings for community members, including Holocaust survivors and their descendants, to paint ceramic butterflies. The local effort, offered by the Mandell Jewish Community Center (JCC) and Voices of Hope (VOH), is part of The Butterfly Project, a global movement to paint 1.5 million butterflies to honor the same number of children murdered in the Holocaust — and to symbolize hope.

Participants painted butterflies at the Mandell JCC and during VOH's 2nd annual Holocaust Survivor Day. During this special event, survivors and their families celebrated the lives of all those who rebuilt their lives after the war.

"It was a lovely day to honor and recognize our local survivors and participate in The Butterfly Project," says Kathy Fishman, Executive Director of VOH. "The ceramic butterflies symbolize courage, justice, remembrance and hope, and will be included in a permanent memorial located at the Mandell JCC."

Community Action Grants Build a Better World

Board-directed Community Action grants from the Foundation's Unrestricted Funds support the long-term strength and vitality of the Greater Hartford Jewish community. The Foundation seeks unique opportunities to strategically invest in programs and services that might not be possible without the Foundation's support. Here are a few highlights from FY'22.

Grant Supports Growth of UCONN Hillel

A new Capacity-Building Grant is supporting the long-term sustainability of UCONN Hillel. The \$20,000 investment will allow UCONN Hillel to share one Marketing Manager with two other Hillels. This full-time professional will manage grassroots activities such as direct mail campaigns and online fundraising, and will share and execute best practices from other Hillel International professionals.

"This grant will allow our current staff to dedicate more hours to building relationships, creating quality programming and expanding our fundraising reach, so we can fuel our growth and help more students explore Judaism and Jewish values," says Edina Oestreicher, Executive Director of UCONN Hillel.

Foundation Expands Support for Synagogues

In recognition of the centrality of our synagogues and their impact on our community, the Foundation is now offering synagogues the ability to apply for Capacity-Building Grants of up to \$10,000.

“The Foundation’s Capacity-Building Grant has brought renewed energy and focus to our community,” says Rabbi Yitzchok Adler of Beth David Synagogue. “Our Board and membership are excited about designing a strategic plan to ensure our vision of a vibrant modern Orthodox community in West Hartford.”

Synagogues can request a Capacity-Building Grant to invest in their organization’s infrastructure to enhance its ability to achieve its mission, and to build resiliency and long-term sustainability.

When COVID halted in-person services at Beth El Temple, leaders used their Capacity-Building Grant to launch streaming services that engaged more members and attracted potential members. But, Beth El saw even more potential for engagement. The grant, which helped fund the costs of installing technology throughout the building, allowed the synagogue to show all of its programs, classes and activities via Livestream and Zoom with a mobile video setup.

“We recently broadcast from one of our function rooms a program on ‘Jewish Views on Abortion’ after the recent Supreme Court decision, which drew many young families as well as other members to participate online,” says Rabbi Howard Sowalsky, Ritual and Executive Director at Beth El Temple.

Each synagogue may also apply for one Micro Grant of up to \$2,000 per fiscal year (except if it receives a capacity building grant) to support a program or project of strategic value to the congregation and/or local Jewish community, including professional or lay development, education programs for religious schools outside the normal curriculum, and community outreach programs.

A Micro Grant will help Temple Beth Hillel of South Windsor develop a new Tot Shabbat series to expand its reach to prospective young members and families in the region. Tot Shabbat activities

introduce children and their parents to the joys of Jewish life, including a Sukkot Tot Shabbat where each family receives a Lulav & Etrog to use together in the Sukkah and, of course, a Chanukah Tot Shabbat.

“Despite the challenges of the past couple of COVID years, our Temple has had quite an influx of new families at services and activities; many of them are young adults, some with infants or babies on the way,” says Rabbi Jeffrey Glickman. “Our new Tot Shabbat services are an important part of the message that our Temple is a meaningful and welcoming home for everyone.”

In its first year of this expanded program, the Foundation awarded six Capacity-Building Grants and four Micro Grants, worth a total of \$63,275.

"The Fund allows us to collaborate closely as a family in order to help alleviate suffering and insecurity and help bolster the kind of Jewish education that emphasizes religious pluralism, tolerance, kindness, self-empowerment, personal responsibility, academic freedoms and communal engagement," says Jonas. "Our mission also highlights support for an Israeli society and a definition of Zionism that is similarly rooted in religious pluralism and democratic values."

For Donna, opening this Fund comes at a time of disorder and fragmentation in the world, yet she is optimistic that her family's philanthropic investment will foster new ideas for a better future. "To note that dizzying changes are subjecting Jewish tradition to strains and challenges is obvious," she reflects. "But, if there is meaning in the Jewish past, it is that survival depends on what we do and how determined we are to find alternative possibilities for carrying on and for going forward."

Utilizing endowed giving allows us to "mobilize the resources for the next generation to think about what new creative paths might be forged to energize the Jewish story for the next century," she says.

"Donna and I hope that through our Fund, when we are no longer here to offer counsel, that our children will be inspired by ancient and future examples of generosity, to live up to our most noble values," says Tom. "That's what we mean when we pray for a world to come and the promise of eternal life."

Honoring a Legacy of Science and Teaching

In honor of Arthur Kesten z”l, his family opened a Memorial Fund to benefit children participating in summer science camps at Talcott Mountain Science Center. Art was a lifelong scientist who worked at United Technologies Research Center and founded Nanocap Technologies. He also enjoyed long walks, tennis and running. Art’s wife Hilda and their daughters, Gwen and Ilene, and grandkids, Ari, Mikayla, and Austin Girelli, remember him with so much love and admiration. The Foundation is proud to honor Art’s legacy and support his family’s philanthropic goals.

The family lovingly remembers why Art was so passionate about science and education. They say he was fascinated by science and the quest to innovate and improve technology by first understanding the theory behind how things in the world work then taking that information and discovering novel applications.

The family describes Art as an award-winning scientist who never really retired: He spent most

of his retirement years teaching, judging science fairs and sharing his love of STEM. They also recall that Art was grateful for receiving financial assistance as a young student, so he could pursue an education that would have otherwise been unavailable to him.

Art’s legacy will endure for generations and help hundreds of curious young minds pursue the wonders of STEM at summer camps through the ASK About Science Memorial Fund.

The family hopes that, through children who have similar interests but not the financial means to pursue them, this Fund will provide opportunities to cultivate their interest in science, with mentors and peers alike, within a supportive community.

According to the family, Art would love to know that he played a part in getting kids excited about science and technology in a leisurely setting, and camps hold a special place in his heart and ours because Art and Hilda met each other at a camp more than 65 years ago.

The Blum Family's Legacy: Taking Care of Family and Community

The generous seeds planted decades ago by Louis and Ida Blum, of blessed memory, to support their Jewish community and family will endure forever. The couple planned thoughtfully and gave generously during their lifetime. They also worked with professional advisors to arrange a multi-pronged estate plan that would honor all of their goals. Louis and Ida made sure that, first and foremost, their estate provided for their son, Dick, and his family. In fact, the whole family created deep relationships with the Jewish Association for Community Living (JCL), which provided Dick z”l, and his wife, Kendy, with high-quality care. When Dick passed away in July 2021, a clause in his will provided an after-lifetime gift to JCL for Kendy’s care.

“The opportunity to support Dick and Kendy, a married couple with intellectual disabilities, was unique,” says JCL’s Executive Director Denis Geary. “They were a classic example of how opposites attract. Kendy was the practical problem solver, the planner. Dick was unique and eccentric with a lot of energy,” he continues. “In the beginning of the Blums’ relationship with JCL, they were provided with minimal supports as Kendy had a full-time job and could drive. As they aged and their needs changed, that support became 24 hours per day,” says Denis. “It was a privilege to work with them.”

Louis and Ida’s estate also provided for the long-term success of the community by leaving money for a Community Action Fund at the Foundation, but only after Dick passed away and they were sure his needs were met. The Louis, Ida and Richard Blum Fund allows Trustees to issue grants that invest in innovative projects, emergency needs and long-term solutions that foster growth in Greater Hartford’s Jewish community.

“We are so thankful to Louis and Ida’s commitment and partnership,” says Jacob Schreiber, President and CEO of the Foundation. “Their after-lifetime gifts will help our Trustees be planful — like the Blums were — to safeguard the vibrant future of Jewish Hartford.”

FY'22 Financials

The Jewish Community Foundation of Greater Hartford has a mandate to fulfill its role in Greater Hartford by maximizing dollars available for making grants today and ensuring that charitable dollars entrusted to it are available in perpetuity.

A well-diversified investment strategy, designed by investment experts, and the generosity of our donors enable JCF to meet these objectives.

Investment Portfolio

JCF's assets are managed in a commingled investment pool. JCF has a long-term investment horizon with relatively low liquidity needs. For these reasons, the portfolio can tolerate short- and intermediate-term volatility in the interest of generating higher returns over the long-term.

Financial Oversight

JCF's Investment Committee crafts and implements investment policy and monitors the individual investment managers and their performance. The Investment Committee is assisted by an independent consulting firm, Crewcial Partners, LLC of New York, NY.

The managed investment portfolio includes traditional equity and fixed income investments and alternatives, including private equity, emerging markets and real assets/commodities. Diversification among multiple asset classes helps to reduce the volatility of JCF's portfolio, moderates market risk, and ensures consistent grant making to the community.

Spending Policy

By using a spending policy, JCF helps ensure that charitable funds will be protected for the future while continuing to have impact today. The policy determines the amount that will be available for grant-making and to support JCF's operating budget. The FY 2022 spending rate was 5% of the previous 20-quarters' average ending value of each fund, subject to a 4% floor and 5.5% ceiling of current fair market value at June 30, 2021.

Expenses

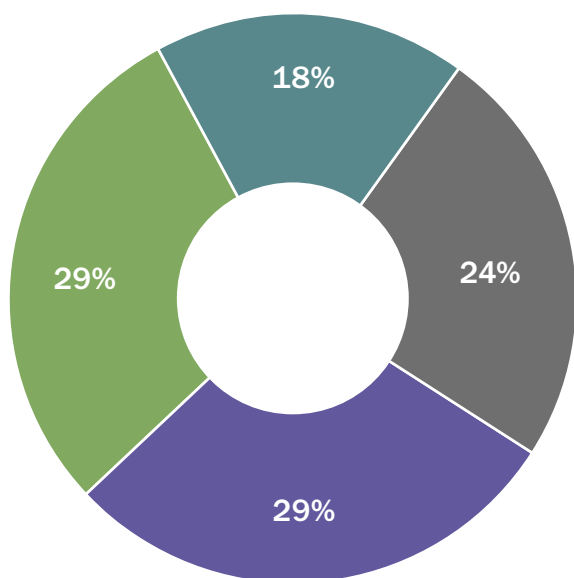
JCF's management and Board of Trustees take careful steps to ensure that the operating expenses are kept as low as possible. JCF's expense to asset ratio for the year was 1.17%.

As of June 30, 2022

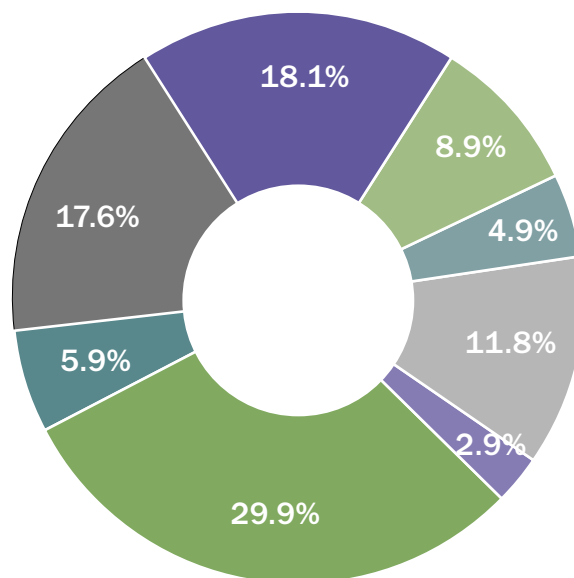
